



**NAYD COUNTRY CO-
ORDINATOR ELECTION
RESULTS 2010**

Preamble

An election was held during April 2010 to elect NAYD Country Co-ordinators. Candidates were invited in advance and during the course of the election to present CV'S, Letter of Intent and social network connections to enhance their election prospects.

Country Co-ordinators

A NAYD Country Coordinator is the link between NAYD and the youth leaders of a specific country. All NAYD officials work on a voluntary basis and focus on enlarging the Network.

To be a Country Coordinator, you must:

- be a youth leader in your country ie run or be member of a development initiative
- have a traceable record in development activism
- have a vision and a plan to achieve it
- be a member of NAYD Yahooogroup
- and be ready to respect the rules and regulations governing NAYD

Tasks of Country Co-ordinator (including his assistants)

- a. Identify and recruit youth leaders in your country to the NAYD virtual network.
- b. Update monthly your country page with pictures and text of activities carried by youth activists of your country.
- c. Recruit more Youth Led organizations working for a better world.
- d. Attend a monthly NAYD web meeting
- e. Support the International team in their diverse activities
- f. Maintain and update in co-ordination with NAYD's webmaster the contact details of the Youth Led organisations

Notes:

The Country Coordinator is the link between NAYD International and the NAYD member organizations in each represented country. He manages the country email and works with his assistant to ensure a regular update of the country's webpage. All Assistant Country Coordinators send their contributions (texts and images) to the Country Coordinator and copies pochitamba@nayd.org.

Assistant CCs answer to their Country Coordinator. The Country Coordinator is answerable to the CEO of NAYD. For all enquiries, worries and comments, they can send an email to info@nayd.org.

All Country Coordinators are responsible for the Youth Led organizations registered in NAYD International under their country. This means at all times, they are expected to make sure these organisations are real and active, and report any fears to NAYD international.
